Free School Meal Provision

Taylor Shaw are providing food hampers for those children who are entitled to Free school Meals in reception to year 6. These will be dropped off at school once a week for parents to collect, they do need two days' notice to order these, so if you think you qualify and would like one but haven't already let us know then please give us a ring.

Online Learning Support

I know that not everyone has access to the internet or a device and that some children are sharing with siblings. We've tried to set tasks that can be done away from the computer as much as possible so that children don't need a device for the whole day. The idea is that they log on, collect their tasks, they work on them mostly away from the computer and then they log back in and upload them for the teachers to mark. This should mean that there is less demand for the technology. However, if you are struggling we will do our best to help. We have ordered some laptops through the government for disadvantaged children and are hoping that they arrive, although I am aware that every school in the country has done the same so we will wait and see. I'd love to give everyone who is struggling a device to use at home but unfortunately we don't have them but we will do our best to support you with the technology you have.
