### **Bikeability On-Road Cycle Training**

I write to inform you that Year 5 and Year 6 children at **Cockfield Primary** have been invited to take part in Durham County Council's Bikeability cycle training programme.

The course, will take place during school hours and consists of four 2 hour sessions, to be held on **13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2022**. The on-road sessions will be conducted on quiet, fully risk assessed roads close to school. The courses are delivered by professionally trained, qualified, and registered instructors and each participant will receive a certificate and badge at the end of the course.

The aim of the course is to improve skills and road craft and, as such, all participants must be able to ride a bike to a basic standard. Participation in the on-road section of the course (Level 2) is dependent upon achieving Level 1.

All bikes must be in a safe and roadworthy condition i.e. working brakes, chain adjusted correctly, tyres inflated and with good tread and the saddle and handlebars adjusted to the correct height. The bikes will be checked for roadworthiness before the start of training and any defects reported back to parents in order that they may be rectified.

Ideally, when seated on a bike, a novice cyclist should be able to touch the ground with at least one foot. If the bike was manufactured with two brakes, they both must be present at the time of training.

All children wishing to take part in the course must wear a cycle helmet during training. If you are buying a helmet, make sure it has the EU standard number BS EN 1078: 1997 and includes the name or trademark of the manufacturer. A limited number of helmets may be available for loan. Hi-visibility waistcoats will be provided and worn throughout the training, but the children will need to wear suitable warm / waterproof clothing.
